





% of adults aged 25-64 participating in education and training, 2013








Problems at the bottom ...

Below Level 1




Opportunities for working together on common issues ...

It can be surprising who has the same issues ...




Obstacles to participation for adults aged 25-64 with low educational attainment (ISCED 0-2)
