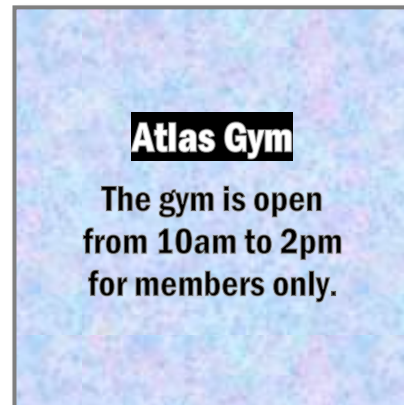

A Wine Tour of Troodos

B Troodos Food and Wine Tour

You will love this trip to some of the most beautiful villages of the Troodos Mountains to visit five traditional food workshops and taste a variety of Cypriot delicacies such as halloumi, honey, wine and traditional sweets. You can learn about the ingredients, the process and the traditions connected to these products. The trip includes an authentic meze lunch at the village of Platres.

C Troodos Churches and Monasteries Tour

The region of Troodos is characterised by the churches and monasteries of the former Byzantine Empire. This tour of the Troodos Mountains lets you sit back and enjoy the scenery without worrying about route planning, ticket buying, or navigating. Visit the small Byzantine churches in the area, and the historical monasteries of Kykkos and Trooditissa with the help of a professional guide.

D Troodos Walking Trip

Enjoy this guided walking tour of the mountains with an expert local guide. The trip starts with the 8km walk of Artemis Trail around Troodos peak. Walk under the tall pine trees and enjoy the excellent views of Cyprus offered when the weather is clear. After a stop at Troodos square, we will walk the 1.2km Myllomeris Waterfalls Trail to visit the highest waterfalls in Cyprus. Bring comfortable walking shoes.

E Troodos Jeep Safari

Get away from the city for a day of exploration in the Troodos Mountains with this tour. You'll travel into the countryside and up into the forest in a jeep, stopping to check out the Asprokremos dam and the Venetian bridges along the way. You'll also visit the Chantara Waterfall, spend time at Kykkos Monastery, sample local wine, and end at the beach at Aphrodite's Rock.

The School in the Clouds

Students living in the Sichuan Province of China climbed for five hours to get to Elementary School in the Gulu mountains. The remote school was in the middle of nowhere, hidden amongst the clouds. It was the only school for the children who lived in the surrounding area. Gulu Elementary School was located halfway up the cliff in a mountainous place. One could reach the place only by walking through a narrow path of around sixteen inches wide at certain points. Children walked along this narrow path to the remote village with the help of their teacher, Shen Qijun. Only after the road was made in 2003 were mules and horses used by students for descending the dangerous path towards their school.



Qijun first arrived at Gulu village as an aspiring 18-year-old teacher. The classroom was made of mud, the roof leaked and the wind howled in through the walls. The school did not have a toilet and when students needed to go to the bathroom, they would sometimes fall and hurt themselves on the rocky ground.

No one outside the village knew about this remote school until a newspaper report was published. It was after that publication that people started donating to help improve the place. More classrooms, a toilet and a playfield were built. However, Gulu Elementary School was still an isolated and remote place where students risked their lives through the narrow rocky path. School resources were too deficient and it was extremely difficult for the children to learn in such a kind of environment.

The School in The Clouds had been operating in the village for 60 years until shutting down on November 18, 2011. There were eleven children attending class, including two 4-year-old children, until local authorities decided that the children would have to attend school in the town below the mountain.

How Couchsurfing Works

Couchsurfing is a service that connects members to a global community of travellers. People use Couchsurfing to find a place to stay or to share their homes with travellers.

Step 1: Create a profile

2. This profile shows who you are: your lifestyle, your hobbies and what's important to you. Having a complete profile is the best way to connect with people, whether you are visiting another member or hosting a guest. Be sure to include photos.

Step 2: Explore your city

Next up, explore your city! Getting in touch with experienced Couchsurfers in your area is the best way to get a feel for how Couchsurfing works. There are weekly events in most cities. 3. .

Step 3: List your couch

Once you've explored the site and have been to an event or two, consider making your couch or spare room available to travellers. Set your couch status under Couch Information. You can set it to "Not Right Now" if you want to be available as a city resource for travellers but are unable to host. 4. Or, you can set it to "Maybe/Yes" to show up in search results for travellers who are planning a trip to your area.

Step 4: Surf the world

When you're ready to travel, search for the city you plan to visit and browse locals with couches available. Look through profiles and references to find people you might want to stay with. 5. We recommend sending about five requests.
