

British festivals are famous the world over. Today, however, we are going to look at festivals you might not know about. Actually, a lot of these are not exactly festivals, but strange races or competitions. Some of them are ancient and some are modern. So, let's start in January in the north of Scotland with the *Burning of the Clavie*. This is a whisky barrel which is set on fire and then carried through the streets as a bonfire. It's an ancient tradition which takes place annually on 11th of January, the first day of the year, according to an older form of the calendar. The bonfire brings good luck for the coming year and people are in the habit of keeping bits of burnt wood as protection against evil spirits.

At the end of January, even further north, in the Shetland Islands, there's another fire festival, the *Up Helly Aa* to mark the end of the *Yule* season. *Yule* is Christmas in Scottish. This seems like a very old festival but has actually only been going for about 130 years. People carry fire-lit torches and a Viking boat through the streets, then set the boat on fire. There's lots of dancing; it's great fun.

Finally, to the north of England. On Shrove Tuesday in February, otherwise known as Pancake Day, a special Pancake Bell is rung in Scarborough. Everyone goes down to the beach where they skip and have pancake races. This is quite common in the UK, running with a frying pan and tossing a pancake at the same time. Jumping isn't a piece of cake though as skip ropes are really long and up to fifteen people skip at a time.

So, that's just a taste of a few of our old and more modern traditions. Would you like to take part in any of them?

business, so he pays his employees to do just that. Employees who

sleep at least six hours a night, for at least five days a week, are awarded points by Kazuhiko Moriyama's company, *Crazy Inc.*, a wedding organiser in Japan. 16.

Nightly rest will be tracked using an app made by *Airweave Inc.*, a mattress manufacturer.

More than 92 percent of Japanese over the age of 20 say that they aren't getting enough sleep, according to a survey by Fuji Ryoki, a health-products maker. Due to a shortage of workers and a work culture that demands long hours, Japan has become known for a phenomenon called 'death from overwork'. 17.

Employees with happier lives will perform better at the office, according to Moriyama. "You have to protect workers' rights, otherwise the country itself will weaken," Moriyama said. In addition to the sleep incentives, *Crazy* promotes better nutrition, exercise and a more positive office environment. 18.

There's some evidence that more sleep will lead to improved business performance and higher economic growth. 19. For Japan, the loss is estimated to be \$138 billion yearly, which is certainly not peanuts.


